I. <u>Catalog Description:</u>

MAT 0124 - Beginning Algebra (Prerequisite: Appropriate placement score for MAT

0124). A course in algebra to include operations with real numbers, linear equations, the coordinate system, linear inequalities, laws of exponents, operations with polynomials, and factoring. Four lectures. Four hours institutional credit. (Not designed to transfer.)
