### PRINCIPLES OF ACCOUNTING I

**<u>3 CREDIT HOURS</u>** 

### I. <u>Catalog Description:</u>

ACC 2213 - Principles of Accounting I (Pre-requisite: MAT 0124 or higher or placement test score for MAT 1233 or higher). Study of the fundamentals and application of financial accounting principles that relate to business. The topics to be covered include the accounting cycle and the accounting systems for service and merchandising businesses. Three lectures. Three hours credit.

- B. Process information through the accounting cycle
- C. Prepare and interpret financial statements
- D. Identify internal controls and ethics
