I. <u>Catalog Description:</u>

BAD 2323 – Business Statistics (Prerequisite: MAT 1313). Introduction to statistical methods of describing, summarizing, comparing, and interpreting data to include probability distributions, sampling, estimation, confidence intervals, and hypothesis testing. Three lectures. Three hours credit.
