COURSE DESCRIPTION

INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNIQUE

This course is an online course. The method of presentation for this course will include assigned textbook readings, chapter quizzes, written reports, and two proctored exams. Examinations are directly related to material presented in the text. It is the students responsibility to read the text and take quizzes and tests on time.

OUTCOME COMPETENCIES

At the end of the course, the student will be able to explain the goals of contemporary physical education, the history of physical education, and have knowledge in how to teach physical education classes.

METHODS OF EVALUATION

Grades will be calculated based on correct answers on the chapter quizzes, written assignments, a proctored midterm exam, and a proctored final exam.

ATTENDANCE

The student must sign in to Blackboard and complete the assignments in a timely manner at least once a week. Failure to submit the weekly assignments by the due date will result in an absence. According to the attendance policy, a student is placed on probation after obtaining two absences (failure to submit work) and will be dropped for excessive absences (3 absences).
