## **Art Appreciation Syllabus**

### Course Information

Art Appreciation, ART 1113

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### Course Description

This course is designed to provide an understanding and appreciation of the visual arts.

### Objectives

Students will cover a variety of topics including art theory, art media and art history. Art Theory includes the elements of art and the principles of design. The art media includes drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, sculpture, site specific art, architecture, crafts and design. The art history covers the art produced from prehistoric times to the 21st century.

### Instructional Techniques

The material for the course will be presented through readings in the textbook, online asynchronous discussion boards, and multimedia exercises. The class is paced by completion of weekly assignments. This class will use ebooks that can be access through the Canvas course.

### Outcome Competencies

Students will understand the relationship between culture and the visual arts. They will be able to recognize great works of art as well as the style of the artist that produced them. Students will understand and be able to use basic art terminology in written assignments. They will also be able to identify different art media.

### Methods of Evaluation

Each chapter will have a homework assignments based on the reading for that chapter as well as a quiz on the material covered. There will also be two proctored tests during the semester. These will be the midterm and the final.

### Attendance

Attendance will be determined by completion of a weekly quiz. A student will be withdrawn from the course after 3 absences.

### Grading

This course will use a ten point grading scale: 90-100: A, 80-89: B, 70-79: C, 60-69: D, 59 and below: F. Homework and quiz grades will count as 50% of the final grade. The other 50% of the final grade will be derived from the mid term (25%) and the final (25%).
